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The Muscogee (Creek) Nation Department of Health (MCNDH) provides comprehensive health care services to Native Americans living within the Muscogee (Creek) Nation. MCNDH is an integrated system of six health centers, an Express Care Clinic, two hospitals, a physical rehabilitation center and nine comprehensive community health programs Offering services across the lifespan including pediatrics, family medicine, nursing, dental, laboratory, radiology, pharmacy, behavioral health, emergency medical, audiology, nutrition, physical therapy and optometry.

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**DESCRIPTION OF ASSIGNMENT:** This position will provide Screening, Brief Intervention and Referral to Treatment (SBIRT), clinical assessment, therapeutic interventions and other care coordination at primary health care settings.

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**REQUIREMENTS:** Candidates must meet the following requirements:

Master's Degree in Social Work and or related field and valid LCSW/LPC/LMFT/LADC licensure or licensed-eligible. A minimum of two (2) years relevant work experience with substance abuse patients. Must possess a valid Oklahoma Driver's License and be insurable. LCSW, LPC, LMFT, or LADC/MH licensure valid in the State of Oklahoma is required.

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**EVALUATION METHODS:** Applicants who meet the requirements described above will be evaluated to determine the extent to which they possess or have the potential to acquire knowledge, skills, abilities and personal characteristics, (KSAP's) required of this position. Applicants should address the following KSAP's on a separate attachment to their application.

1. A broad-based quality range of knowledge acquired through professional experience in the field of counseling.
2. Proven skill and ability in the areas of substance abuse and mental health treatment, assessment, diagnostics and consultation.
3. Knowledge of psychotherapeutic/behavioral intervention techniques, screenings, and assessments.
4. Ability to follow BHS guidelines, IHS guidelines and established MCNDH Policies and Procedures.
5. Ability to courteously and effectively communicate with patients and their families, MCNDH staff, outside agencies and the general public both orally and in writing.
6. Ability to maintain strict confidentiality.
7. Ability to maintain a professional demeanor.
