Muscogee Nation Department of Health (MCN Health) provides comprehensive health care services to Native Americans living within the Muscogee Nation. MCN Health is an integrated system of six health centers, an Express Care Clinic, three hospitals, a physical rehabilitation center and nine comprehensive community health programs. Offering services across the lifespan including pediatrics, family medicine, nursing, dental, laboratory, radiology, pharmacy, behavioral health, emergency medical, audiology, nutrition, physical therapy, and optometry.

DESCRIPTION OF ASSIGNMENT: The purpose of this position is to perform the duties of a Therapist and Human Services Professional for the Behavioral Health Services Program or Grant. Incumbent provides services within the designated service area of the Muscogee Creek Nation Department of Health.

REQUIREMENTS: Master's Degree in Counseling Psychology or related field and licensed as an LCSW, LPC, LMFT, or LADC-MH licensure valid in the State of Oklahoma is required. LCSW, LPC, LMFT, or LADC-MH licensure valid in the state of Oklahoma is required.

EVALUATION METHODS: Applicants who meet the requirements described above will be evaluated to determine the extent to which they possess or have the potential to acquire knowledge, skills, abilities, and personal characteristics, (KSAP's) required of this position. - A broad-based quality range of knowledge acquired through professional experience in the field of counseling.
- Proven skill and ability in the areas of treatment, prevention, assessment, diagnostics, and consultation.
- Ability to follow BHS guidelines and established Muscogee (Creek) Nation Department of Health policies and procedures.
- Ability to courteously and effectively communicate with patients and their families, DOH staff, outside agencies, and the general public both orally and in writing.
- Ability to maintain strict confidentiality.
- Ability to maintain a professional demeanor.
- Knowledge of psychotherapeutic/behavioral intervention techniques.
- Clinical understanding and experience utilizing a specialized modality of treatment with a specific patient population (play therapy, substance abuse, autism, trauma, depression, suicidal, children/youth).
 Certifications are not mandatory but are encouraged. Certifications signify knowledge learned but does not signify mastery.
